SPEAKER: Our guest speaker will be Neelima Sehgal, Physics

Bio: Neelima Sehgal obtained her B.S. in Physics and Mathematics from Yale University, and her PhD in Physics and Astronomy from Rutgers University. She was a postdoctoral fellow at Stanford University and Princeton University, before joining Stony Brook University in 2012. She is currently Professor of Physics and Astronomy at Stony Brook, and lives in East Setauket, New York. Neelima has just been named a “Fellow of the American Physical Society”.

Title: Discoveries from the Cosmic Microwave Background, the Oldest Light in the Universe

Abstract: Cosmic microwave background (CMB) experiments have contributed powerful constraints on the fundamental properties of the Universe. Upcoming CMB experiments such as the Simons Observatory are poised to extend this progress even further. However, CMB experiments still have a wealth of information to offer beyond near-term facilities regarding the properties of dark matter, the birth of the Universe, and the Universe's particle inventory. In particular, a much lower-noise and higher-resolution wide-area CMB survey can open a new window on fundamental physics and astrophysics. I will discuss recent CMB results, near-term prospects, and CMB-HD, a next-generation CMB facility.
