3. All courses taken to meet major requirements must be taken for a letter grade. No grade lower than C may be applied toward the major. At least 12 credits in Core Requirements must be completed within the Department of History at Stony Brook.		
4. Related Disciplines include: Africana Studies, Anthropology, Art, English, Hispanic Languages & Literature, Political Science, Sociology, and Women's, Gender & Sexuality Studies. A student may petition to have courses from a different external discipline accepted if the case can be made that they are directly relevant to the student's area of concentration within the History major.
